




Pollux: Welcome to the School for Good and Evil. I'm Pollux, your welcoming leader.






Pollux: Oh dear. Yuba the Gnome misplaced his directions for the Blue Forest.




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TEACHER'S PET

Ingredients:


- 1 cucumber
- 1 apple
- 2 stalks celery
- 1 inch ginger
- 1/2 lemon

Instruments:

- Peeler
- Juicer

Instructions:

- 1. Wash the vegetables and fruits. If they are not organic, lightly peel the skin or scrub with a fruit veggie wash to remove any and all pesticides.
- 2. Juice the cucumber first, followed by the apple, ginger, lemon, and celery.
- 3. Drink plain or pour over ice, then enjoy your cool and replenishing cucumber juice.



AGATHA'S BUTTERY & BEETLED BISCUITS

Ingredients:

- 1 large egg
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter (1 stick), very soft
- 1/2 cup light brown sugar, packed
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 1/2 cups old-fashioned whole rolled oats (not instant or quick cook)
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt, or to taste
- 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips, plus more for after baking (though these can substituted with raisins, walnuts, etc.)

<u>Instruments</u>:

- Measuring cups
- Measuring spoons
- · Baking sheet
- Large bowl

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350F, line a baking sheet with a cookie sheet or spray with cooking spray, and then set aside.
- 2. In a large bowl, add the egg, butter, sugars, and vanilla. Mix with a spoon aggressively for about 90 seconds, or until smooth and slightly fluffed. Your bicep and shoulder should be burning if you've mixed well enough.
- 3. Add the oats, flour, baking soda, and salt. Stir to combine.
- 4. Add the chocolate chips (or your choice of substitute) and stir to combine.
- 5. Using a 2-tablespoon cookie scoop, form mounds and place on prepared baking sheet spaced about 2 inches apart.
- 6. Bake for about 10 to 13 minutes (shorter for super soft cookies, longer for more well-done cookies) or until the edges have set and the tops are just set. Even if slightly undercooked, pale, and glossy in the center, don't over-bake. The cookies will firm up as they cool.
- 7. Immediately upon taking the baking sheet out of the oven, add about 5 additional chocolate chips per cookie. Allow the cookies to cool on the baking sheet for about 10 minutes. Though they are best enjoyed when one is alone and can eat them all at once, there is also something to be said for sharing them with a friend.

HESTER'S GINGERBREAD DEMONS

Ingredients

- 3/4 cup butter, softened
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 large egg, room temperature
- 3/4 cup molasses
- 4 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons ground ginger
- 1-1/2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1-1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 3/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- Vanilla frosting of your choice
- Food coloring

<u>Instruments:</u>

- Measuring cups
- Measuring spoons
- 2 bowls
- Baking sheet
- Frosting tools

Instructions:

- 1. In a large bowl, cream butter and brown sugar until light and fluffy for about 5-7 minutes. Add egg and molasses. Combine the flour, ginger, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves and salt, and then gradually add to creamed mixture and mix well.
- 2. Cover and refrigerate for 4 hours or overnight so that the dough becomes easy to handle.
- 3. Preheat oven to 350°. On a lightly floured surface, roll dough to 1/8-in. thickness. Cut with floured 2-1/2-in. cookie cutters, then mutilate as much as you desire.

 Place I in. apart on ungreased baking sheets.
- 4. Bake until edges are firm, 8-10 minutes. Remove to wire racks to cool. Tint some of the frosting red and some green; leave remaining frosting plain. Decorate cookies with with creepy and unusual traits of your choosing, like red eyes or jagged teeth.







